Can you create an Earth Saving Superhero for Earth Day? Decide your superhero's name, their special powers (e.g. planting trees or cleaning oceans), their costume and one mission they complete to protect the planet.

You could include them on your poster too!

Earth Day

Earth Day is coming up on Saturday 18th April 2026. This is an annual day to celebrate our planet and to consider why it's important that we protect it. The theme this year is 'Our Power, Our Planet'. Many of our activities link to this theme.

For this activity we'd like you to observe and report on your local environment by creating a weather journal over the course of the week!

You can record the daily weather by:

1. Drawing what the sky looks like.
2. Measuring rainfall in a homemade rain collector (mug + ruler) or kitchen jug.
3. Noting the wind direction using a simple DIY windsock such as this one 'Windsock Craft'
4. Writing one sentence about the weather each day.



Value: 2 credits

Poster

Design a poster to show some of the different ways that we can be kind to and protect our planet. You might need to research this with a parent/carer first. Be as creative as possible and display your poster at home!

Value: 1 credit

Construction Challenge

Research a famous landmark from your local area or from across the world.

Can you get creative and build this out of lego or cardboard/recycled materials?

Value: 1 credit

Mini Museum

Go on a scavenger hunt around your house or outdoors and collect some interesting items. Can you then:

1. Arrange them like a museum display
2. Create labels
3. Decide on a museum name
4. Give someone a tour of your exhibit

Your items could all be linked or completely random!

Value: 1 credit
