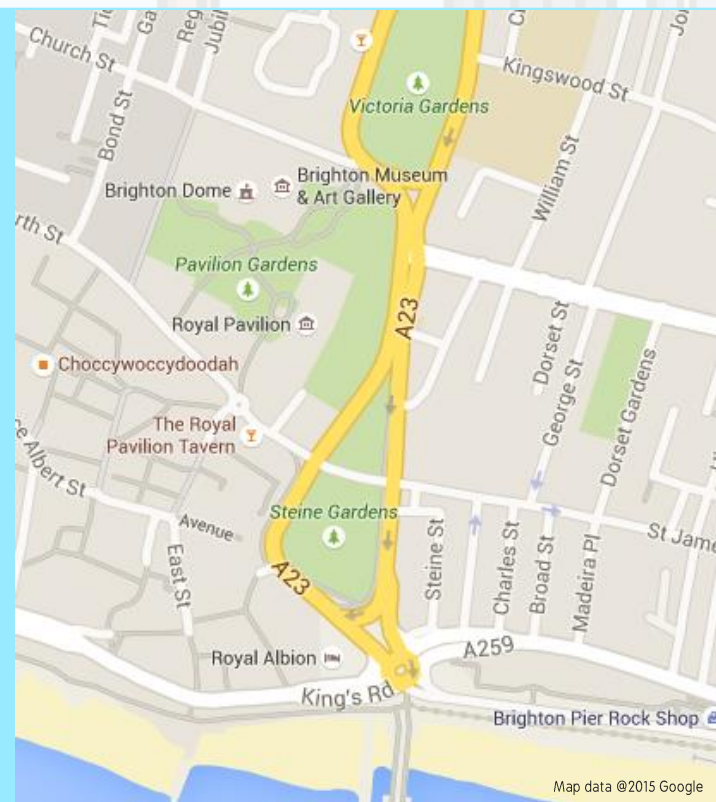
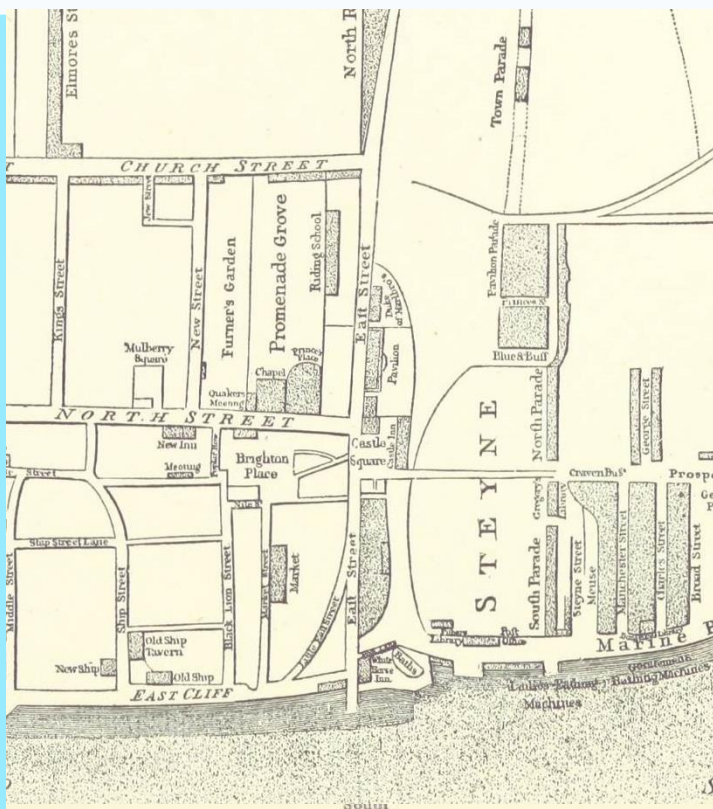

What Can Maps Tell Us About Changes?

These are both maps of Brighton. The left is from 1880 and the right is from 2015.

What differences can you see? (roads and buildings)

What does this tell us about changes that have happened since 1880?

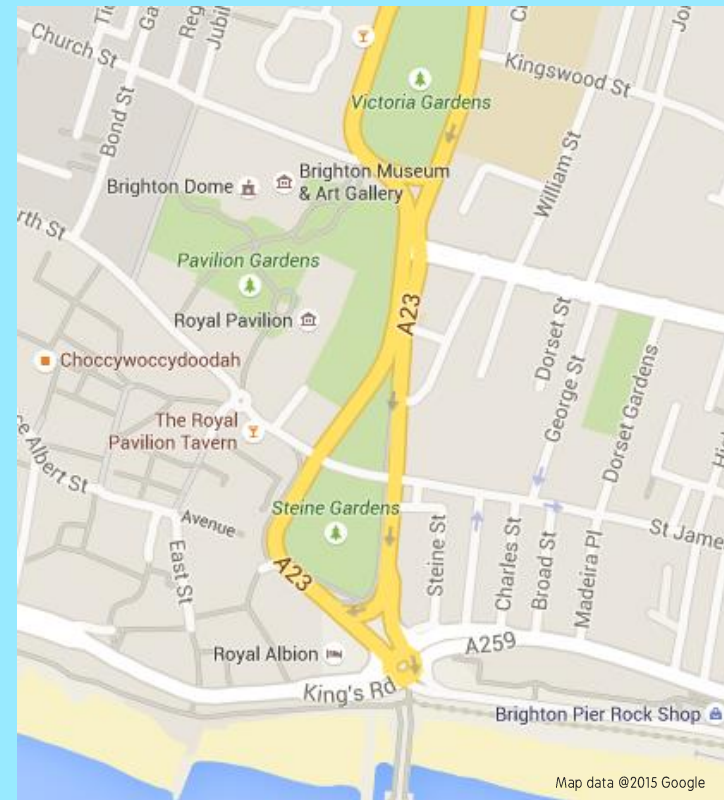
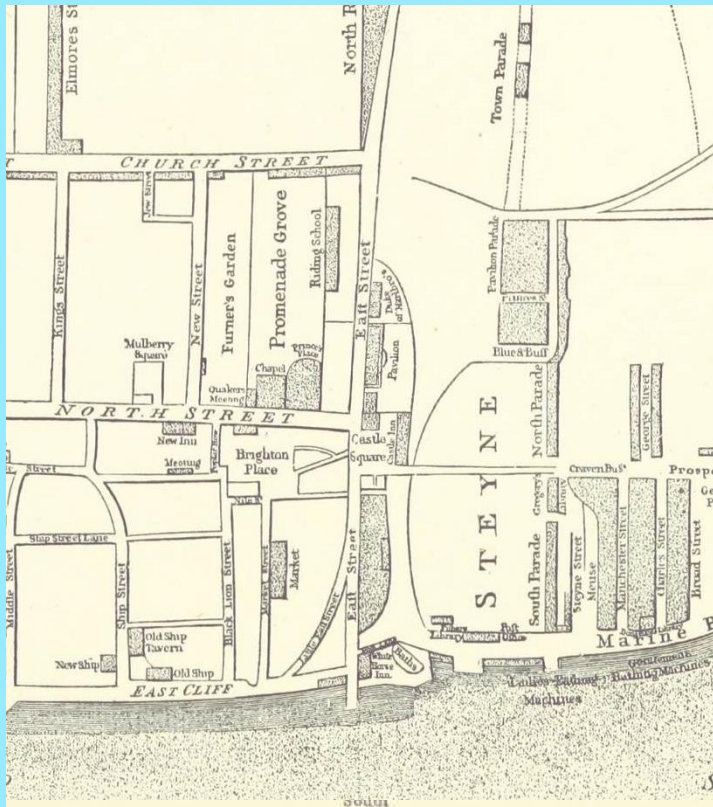


Changes:

There is now a main road to the sea front and there are more roads than in 1880.

The buildings in 1880 were used for public houses (pubs), stables, riding school, public baths. Nowadays they are used for shops, hotels, public houses, museums et.

The changes tell us there have been changes in modes of transport, sanitation facilities in houses (baths).

Use a **red** to highlight features that have disappeared.

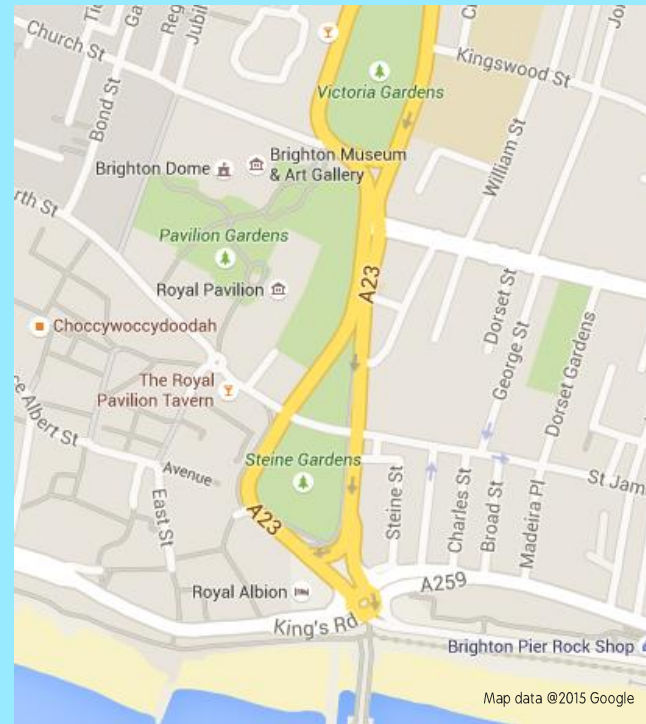
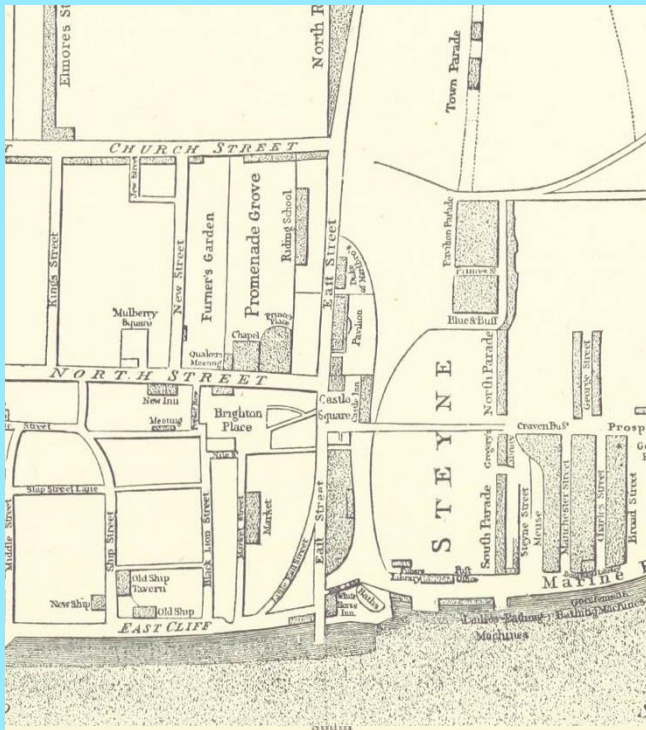
Use a **green** to show features that have appeared.
