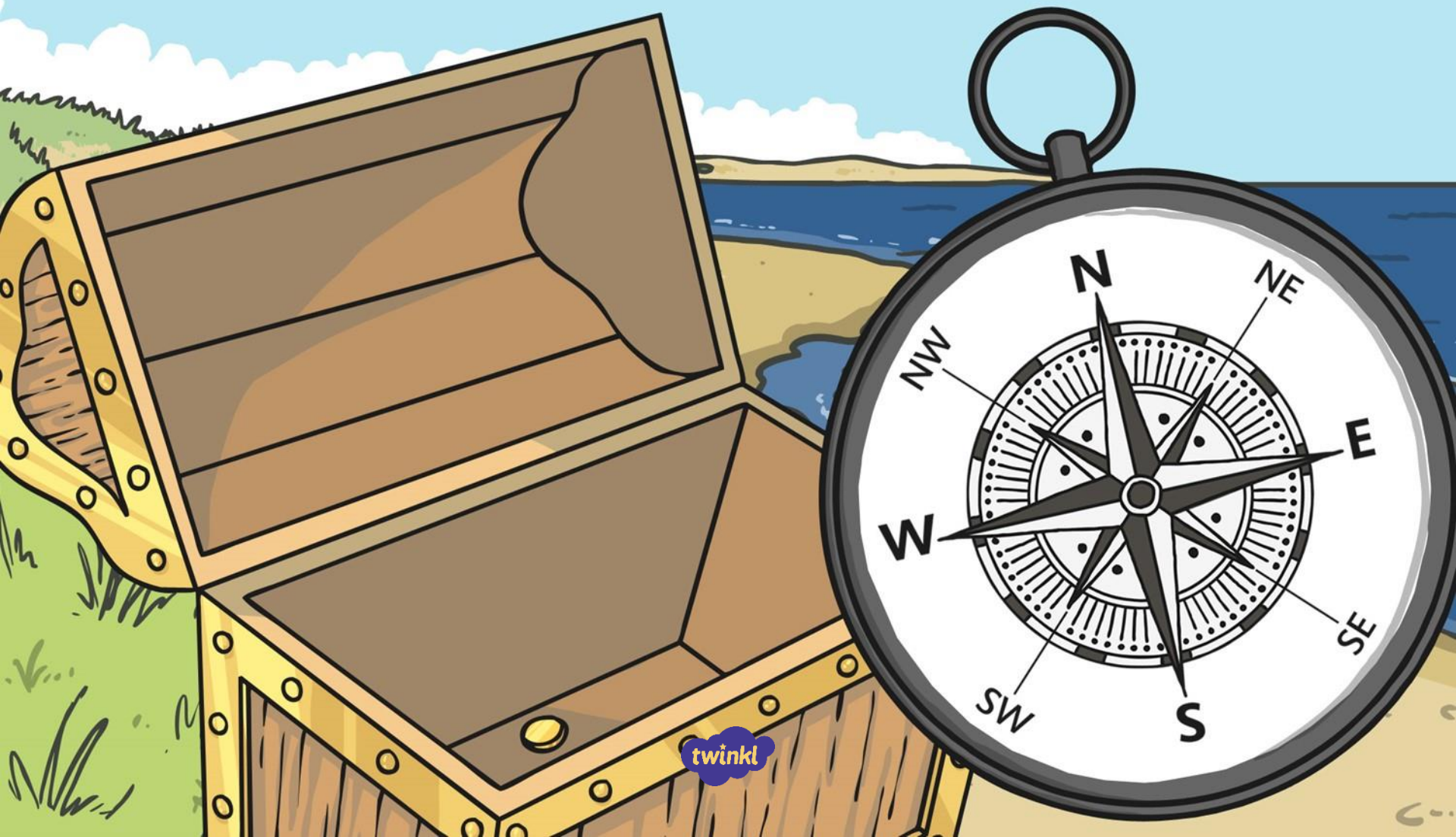

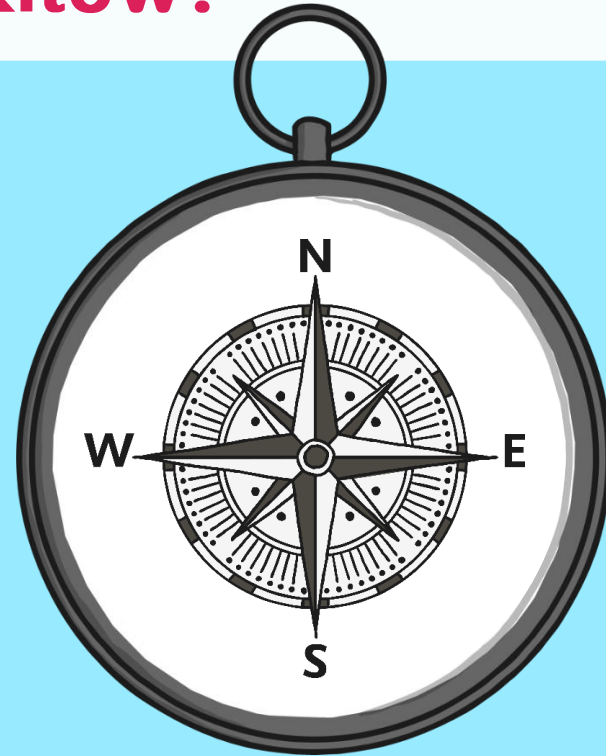

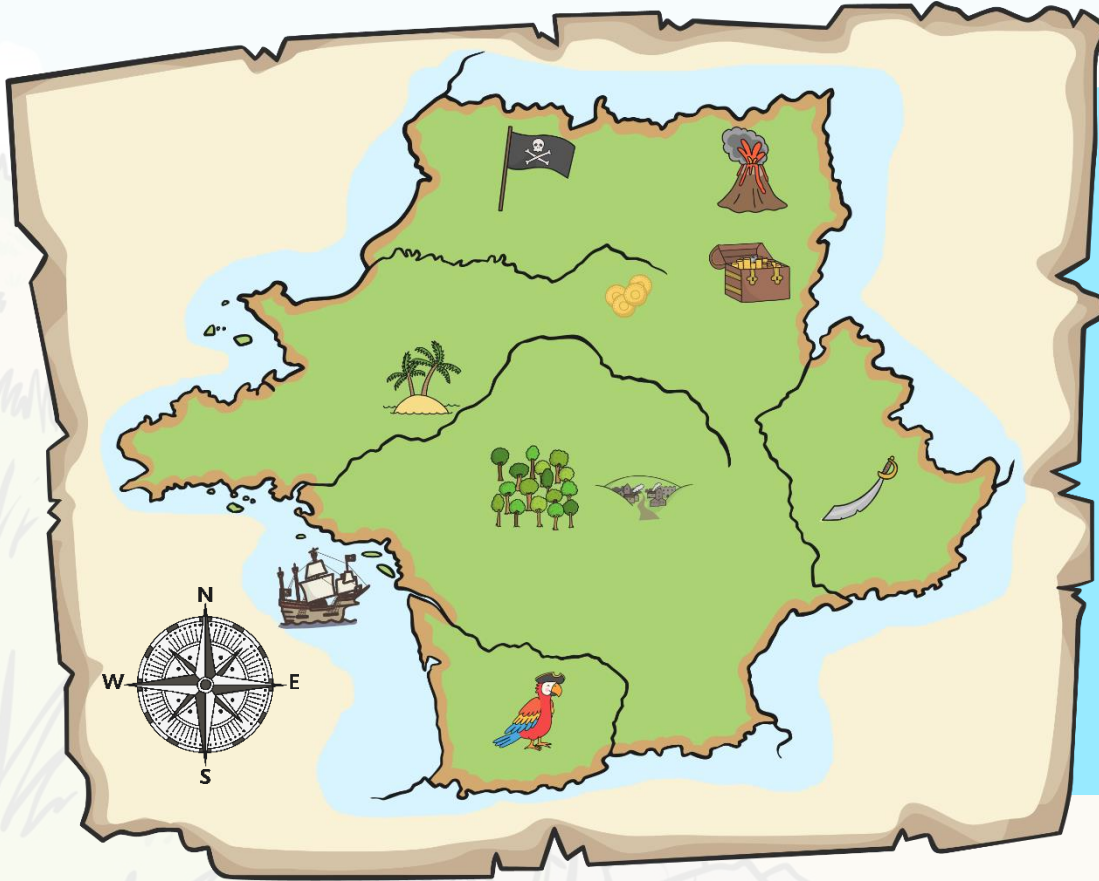

How could you get from the parrot to the flag?

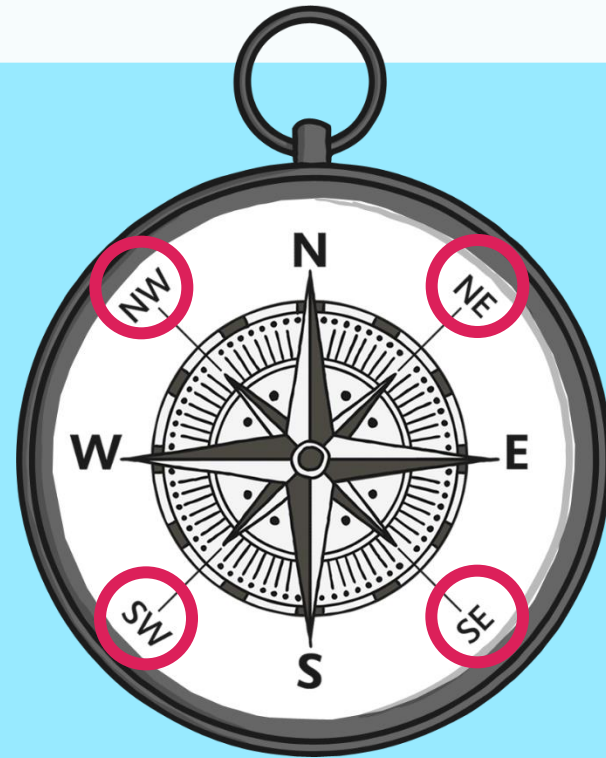
What about from the cutlass to the forest?

How could you get from the palm trees to the treasure?

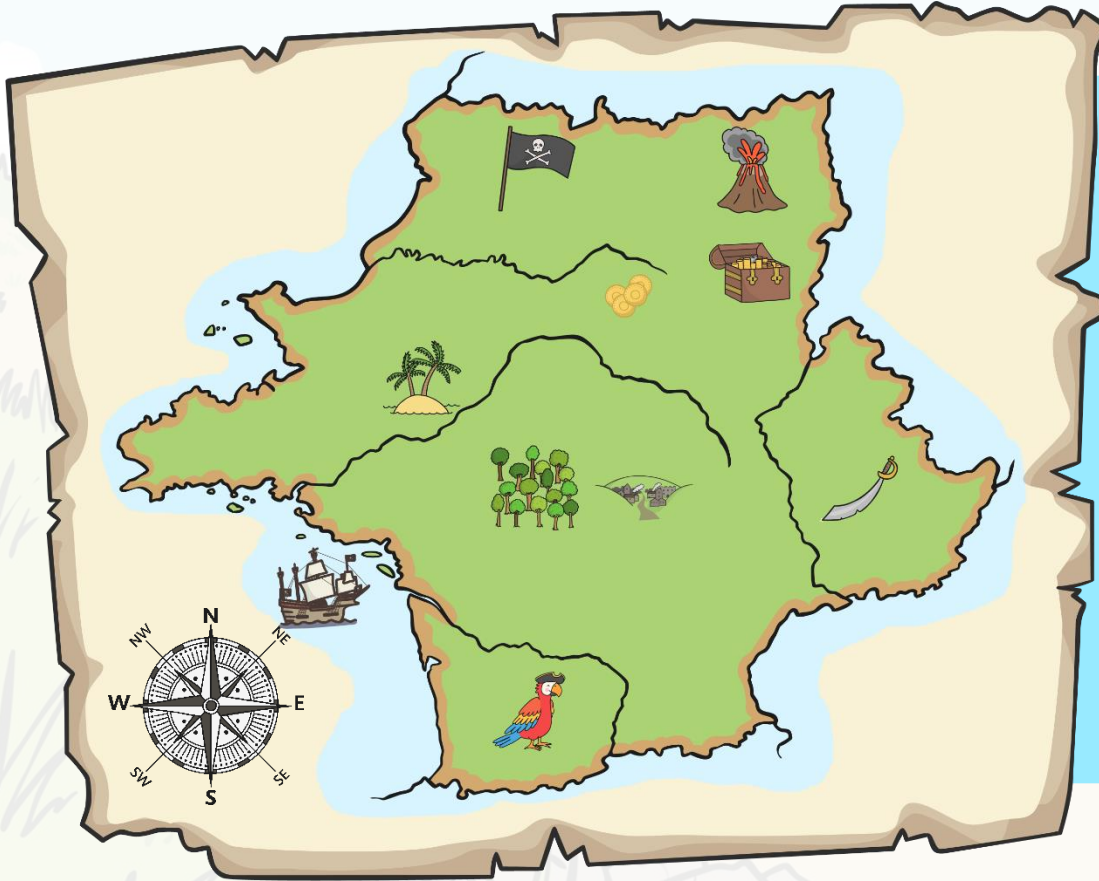
# Where Shall We Go?

# Where Shall We Go Now?

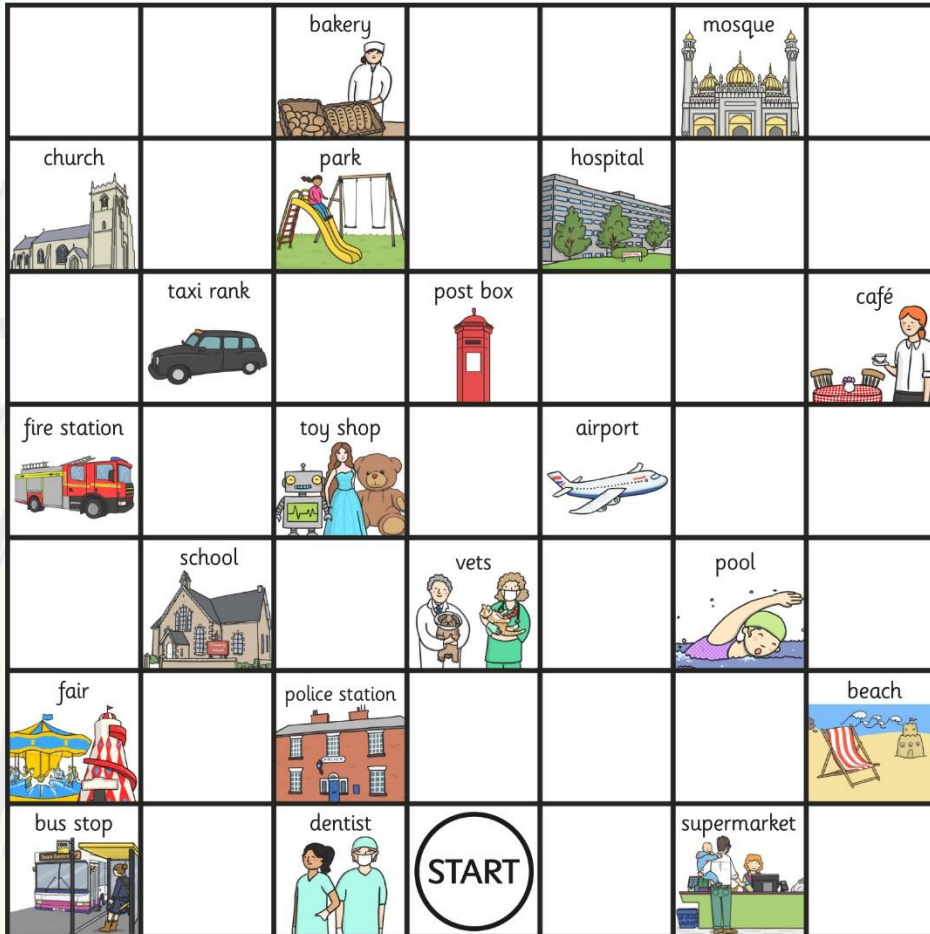


How could you get from the palm trees to the treasure?

# Follow Your Partner

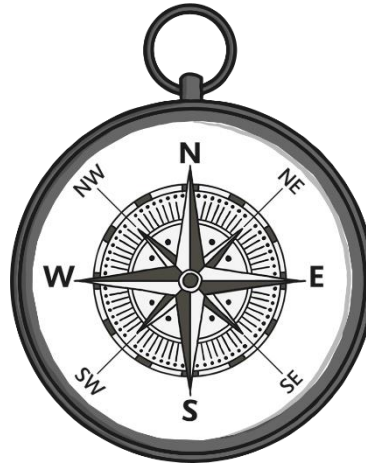
Your partner (an adult or sibling if possible) is going to instruct you to copy their drawing as they make it.
