LBQ – Tuesday Spelling – words ending in 'ought'

The letters *ought* and *aught* can be used to spell the sound /ort/.

Examples:

bought	He bought me a huge bunch of flowers.
brought	The lost child was brought back home.
thought	I thought you'd be ready by now.
sought	They sought the escaped prisoner.
nought	Nought means nothing.
caught	The thief was caught in the act.
fraught	There was a fraught silence.
distraught	She was distraught at the thought of her kitten lost in the cold.

LBQ – Thursday Spelling – words ending in 'tial' -cial & -tial endings usually sound the same "shul" e.g. special, confidential, initial, official

Rule:

Use -cial after a vowel, like after the vowel 'o' in social, 'e' in special, 'i' in beneficial

Use **-tial** after a consonant, especially, after 'n' in substa**n**tial, esse**n**tial, and 'r' in pa**r**tial
