LBQ- Monday Words ending in 'ence'

 Use ence after soft c (/s/ sound), soft g sound and qu, or if there is a related word with a clear ε sound in the right position.

Examples:

absence

confidence

evidence

independence

patience

LBQ – Tuesday Use commas to clarify meaning Let's eat Grandma! Let's eat, Grandma!

The first sentence suggests that we should eat Grandma, poor lady! The second makes it clear that the writer is telling their grandmother that it is time to eat.

LBQ - Wednesday Words ending in 'ency'

- Use **ency** after soft **c** (/s/ sound), soft **g** sound and **qu**, or if there is a related word with a clear ε sound in the right position.
- Some words ending in *-ent* are changed to nouns by using the ending *-ency*.
- Examples:
- agent > agency
- decent > decency
- frequent > frequency
- urgent > urgency

LBQ – Friday Words ending 'ent'

- Use **ent** after soft **c** (/s/ sound), soft **g** sound and **qu**, or if there is a related word with a clear ε sound in the right position.
- There are many words which end in ent. Here's some examples
