


Wednesday & Thursday

Usually (There are always exceptions to the rule!)

If the root is not a word on it's own, you will add -ible or -ibly

```
horr + ible
not an identifiable
English root word
```

If the root <u>is</u> a word on it's own, you will <u>usually</u> add -able or -ably



Friday

Many adjectives in the English language end in the same sound made with either **-ant** or **-ent**.



It is often tricky to decide which ending to use when you are spelling them...

e.q. is it observant or observent?

A good rule to follow is if the root word can be given an -ation ending then it will usually end in -ant.
