#### Maths Teasers

### Other suggestions for this week:

- Please see attached a letter regarding some fantastic phonics information available to you at home! The letter explains that it is aimed at Reception and Year 1 however pleasure Nursery parents take a look it will give you ideas and knowledge of the learning children may already be doing and what is expected in September.
- Please continue with the measuring activities, the ones I have seen and heard about are fantastic! We are sticking with length and I have attached some 'measuring activities' that you could complete at home together focusing on length. Next week we will move on to a different type of measurement.
- Have a go at sequencing the story of 'The Hungry Caterpillar'. For reception (and Nursery if you wish you have a try) Can you write a sentence to go alongside the picture. Try and use your phonics to spell and try to remember the tricky words such as 'I, the, to, go'
- Can you measure how tall you are! And then measure all the other people in your house!
   You can see who is the tallest and who is the shortest! You might want to measure yourself every 2 weeks to see if you have grown! Try and do this every week until you come back to school
- To support with writing I have attached some practise sentence. You may wish to use
  these alongside the story sequencing or just to practise writing sentences. Some
  children may need support to see some words but a lot of the words in the word bank
  are CVC or phonetically decodable.
- Can you have a try at sorting the healthy and unhealthy foods in the correct boxes?!
- Shopping list The Very Hungry Caterpillar has lots of different types of food! Can
  you help to write the shopping list with mummy and daddy? You can copy the labels if
  you wish too and you could even write down using your numbers how many of each items
  you need!
- Days of the week Have a go at practising your days of the week (in order) You can write them down too!
- Take part in the daily Joe Wicks work out and get all the family involved!
- We know that we are very lucky to have beautiful weather at the moment and I know that lots of you want to be in the garden. This is great for physical development!
   Building, running, riding your bike, dancing, on the slide or swing! Please let us know what you are up to in the garden and how you are keeping active too!
- If you wish to do something a little more creative! You could make a green leaf caterpillar. All you need to do is collect some green leaves form your garden or your daily walk. Then create a red caterpillar face and add the leaves for the body. You might want to use the leaves or print with them using green paint.
