### A WORD FROM THE PARISH PRIEST



On Tuesday, we will celebrate the Solemnity of the Epiphany. It will also mark the end of the Jubilee Year, as Pope Leo will close the Holy Door at St Peter's Basilica. It has been a strange year, with a change of Pope during the year, which has certainly drawn more people to go to Rome on pilgrimage. Although we had no organised pilgrimage from the parish to Rome, a good number of our parishioners went on a private pilgrimage, as I did myself. It has been an opportunity for other pilgrimages too, and it was

great to see such a large number of people come on the North Staffs pilgrimage to Walsingham on the August bank holiday.

A particular highlight for our Deanery was the North Staffs Eucharistic Congress at the beginning of July. As the one who first suggested the Congress, it was a particular joy (and relief) that it was so well attended, and drew so many people from the Deanery together. It was helped by the schools, especially St Margaret Ward and its staff, and Fr George at Sacred Heart, Tunstall, as well as all those who gave time and energy to help me to plan the event.

The Jubilee Year called us to be Pilgrims of Hope, and that means that we continue on the journey. As pilgrims of hope we have not come to the end of the pilgrimage as we

come to the end of the year. It is a pilgrimage that we continue to tread. It means being challenged to live and more committed life as a Catholic Christian, and especially to make the life of prayer more important in our lives and to seek to grow closer to the Lord.

I would like to thank everyone who has helped during the past year in our parish. There are a number of volunteers who give a huge amount of time and effort. I want to thank them all. Their efforts should not mean the rest of us can sit back and relax—it should be an impetus for all of us to give time and talents to the life of the parish. In the near future we will have a new census of parishioners, and a time and talents survey, so that we can invite everyone to be part of the parish's life.

### SAINT OF THE WEEK



#### St Genevieve 422-512

After the death of her parents, Genevieve moved from her home town to Paris. She became known for her prayer and devotion, and became a great influence in the city. She fasted most of the week and took on penances, but was also known for charity. She also consecrated her-

self as a virgin. When Paris was threatened by an attack of the Huns under Attila in 451, Genevieve brought together the women of the city as a great movement of prayer and fasting, and Paris was spared. When Paris was taken over by the Franks, Genevieve was very influential with the King Clovis and had churches built.

**Epiphany** This Tuesday is the Solemnity of the Epiphany of Our Lord and is a Holy Day of Obligation. There will be a Vigil Mass at St Patrick's at 6.30pm on Monday, and three Masses on Tuesday, at 9.15am at English Martyrs', at 11am at St Joseph's, and at 2.15pm at St John's school, Kidsgrove. Please note there will not be an evening Mass on Tuesday.

**Christmas Cribs** We will dismantle the Christmas cribs in our churches after the Mass on Saturday 10th and Sunday 11th January, the Feast of the Baptism of the Lord, the end of the Christmas season. Please stay to help after Mass.

**Eucharistic Adoration** As a follow on to the Jubilee Year, which ends on Tuesday, we are going to pick up on the encouragement of the Eucharistic Congress that we celebrated in July, and have more opportunities for Eucharistic Adoration in our parish. It has also been lovely having Adoration each day during the Christmas Octave. From the beginning of Ordinary Time, there will be Eucharistic Adoration before all the evening weekday Masses at St Joseph's, and before the Thursday noon Mass at English Martyrs' in the Lady Chapel. It is a beautiful opportunity to come and be before the Lord and to pray silently.

**Christmas Offering** Fr Julian would like to thank all the parishioners for their generosity in the Christmas offering, as well as for other gifts and cards at Christmas.

**Defibrillator** Michael Maughan has volunteered to do a sponsored 15 mile run on the last weekend of January to raise money for an internal defibrillator. We have experienced two people having cardiac arrests in St Joseph's church in under two years. The target is £1000, so please be generous in sponsoring Michael.

**Foodbank update** The English Martyrs' foodbank reopens after Christmas on Thursday 8th January. We made up around 100 Christmas goodie bags which were given out at English Martyrs' and St John's Knyversley foodbanks. Thanks to everyone who donated to the foodbank this Christmas and throughout the year. On the last session before Christmas we had 25 vouchers feeding 87 people. Unfortunately this is the largest number of people needing the foodbank in any one foodbank session since we opened. So the need seems to be increasing, and the help is still necessary.

**Thanks** to all who came to the afternoon of prayer on the Fourth Sunday of Advent, 'Walk with Mary, Young Lady of Grace'. It was lovely to take an hour out of a busy time to pray together.

Once again this year, for the fourteenth year running, we are making our Christmas Crib offering appeal for Mary's Meals. As you are probably already aware, Mary's Meals offers children in the developing world a daily meal on school days, in school, to ensure that they not only receive nourishing

food, but also an education. It is raising the level of development in all the places where it is set up. It uses locally grown food, and local volunteers to make it a community project which is sustainable. But it uses funds which we supply. Mary's Meals is now providing daily food for over 3 million children each day.

We ask our parishioners and visitors to consider supporting the Appeal by providing Mary's meals for a child during the coming year. The cost of feeding one child for the year is £19.15 (let's call it £20), the same as last year.
