A WORD FROM THE PARISH PRIEST

Our parish of Our Lady of Grace, made up of the former three parishes, has had its second birthday during the last month. This week we will be celebrating the feast day of our patroness, Our Lady of Grace. The feast day is 7th February, but we celebrate it on the following Sunday, so that we can celebrate Mary the Mother of Grace in each of our churches. So, next Sunday, we will celebrate the Solemnity of Our Lady of Grace. On that day, we will be inviting all the families from the schools to come to Mass too, so that they can be part of the celebration.

This celebration comes at the end of the same week as the beautiful feast day of Candlemas, the Presentation of Our Lord in the Temple. This feast used to be the end of Christmas-tide, and is certainly the



last feast day connected with our Christmas celebration. From this point onwards our focus is on Easter, and preparing for that, as we will begin Lent in just a couple of week's time. Maybe, even if you don't normally come to a weekday Mass, you could make it to Monday evening's celebration of Candlemas.

As we come to the end of the extended season of Christmas, I look back on our celebrations with gratitude. Our celebration of

Christmas began with the Christmas Masses. I know there is one parishioner who feels particularly blessed that he came to the first Vigil Mass at St Joseph's. From that event, Michael Maughan has set about fundraising among our parishioners so that we can have a defibrillator in church, and he has done really well with that fundraising. It shows the generosity of our parishioners. If we put this side by side with the £1000 raised for the Compassion Kitchen Christmas lunch, and the £5600 raised for Mary's Meals through the crib appeal, and the huge amount of warm clothing and bedding donated for the homeless last week, I wanted to commend your all for this generosity to those in need. Thank you for your compassion and care.

SAINT OF THE WEEK



Bl Andrea Carlo Ferrari 1850-1921

Bl Andrea Carlo was the Cardinal Archbishop of Milan. He was ordained priest aged 23, and was very gifted academically. He was eventually raised to be Bishop, first of Guastalla then of Como, before being appointed Archbishop of Milan and Cardinal. He was a great supporter of Pope

Leo XIII's teaching on social justice. He took responsibility for improving catechesis, the teaching of the faith, in Milan, promoting the catechism of Pope Pius X. He participated in three conclaves and in the International Eucharistic Congress in Westminster in 1908. His funeral was celebrated by the future Pope John XXIII
