Many question words begin with 'wh', but not all of them!

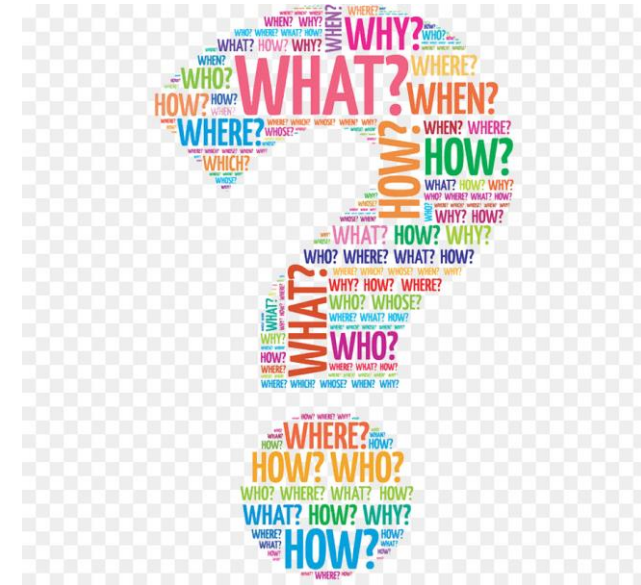

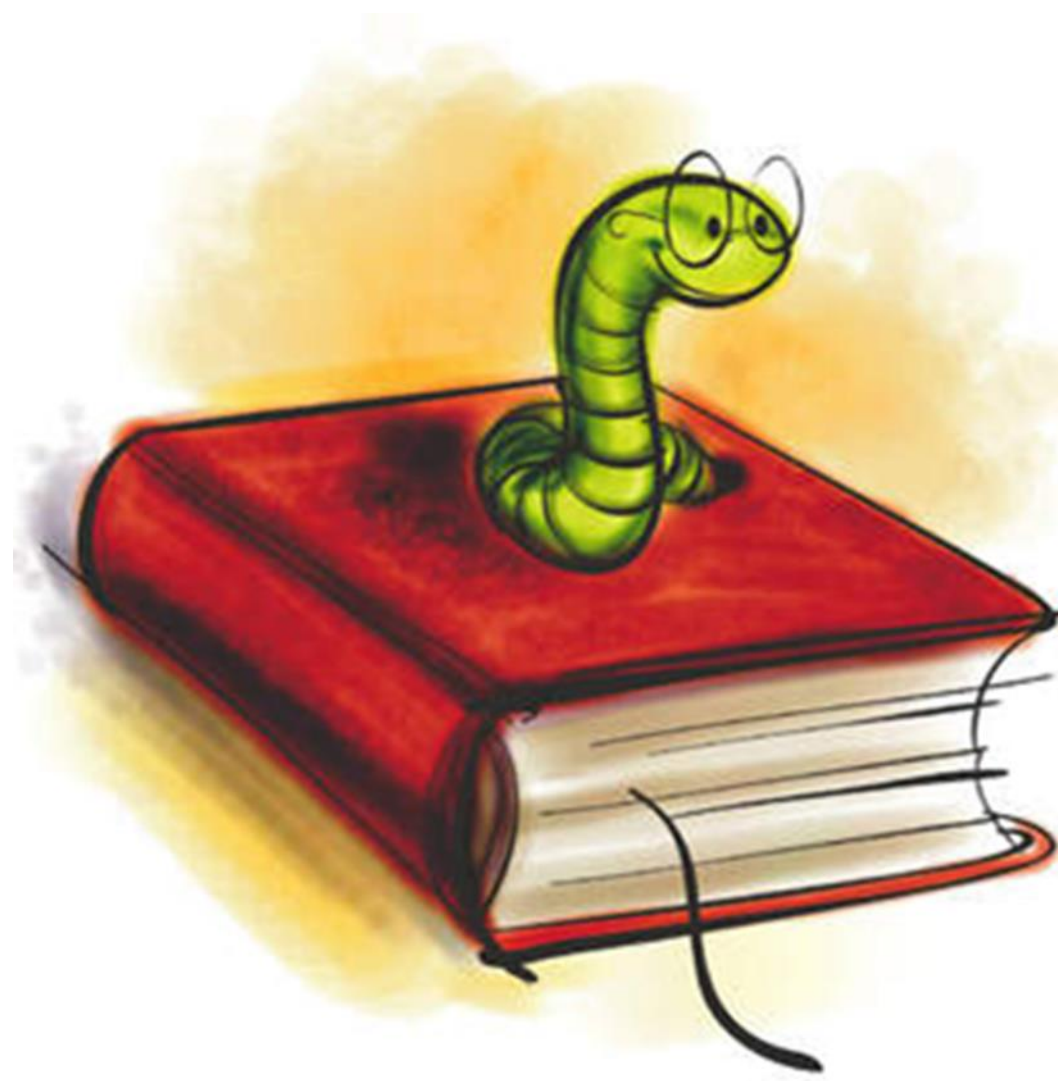

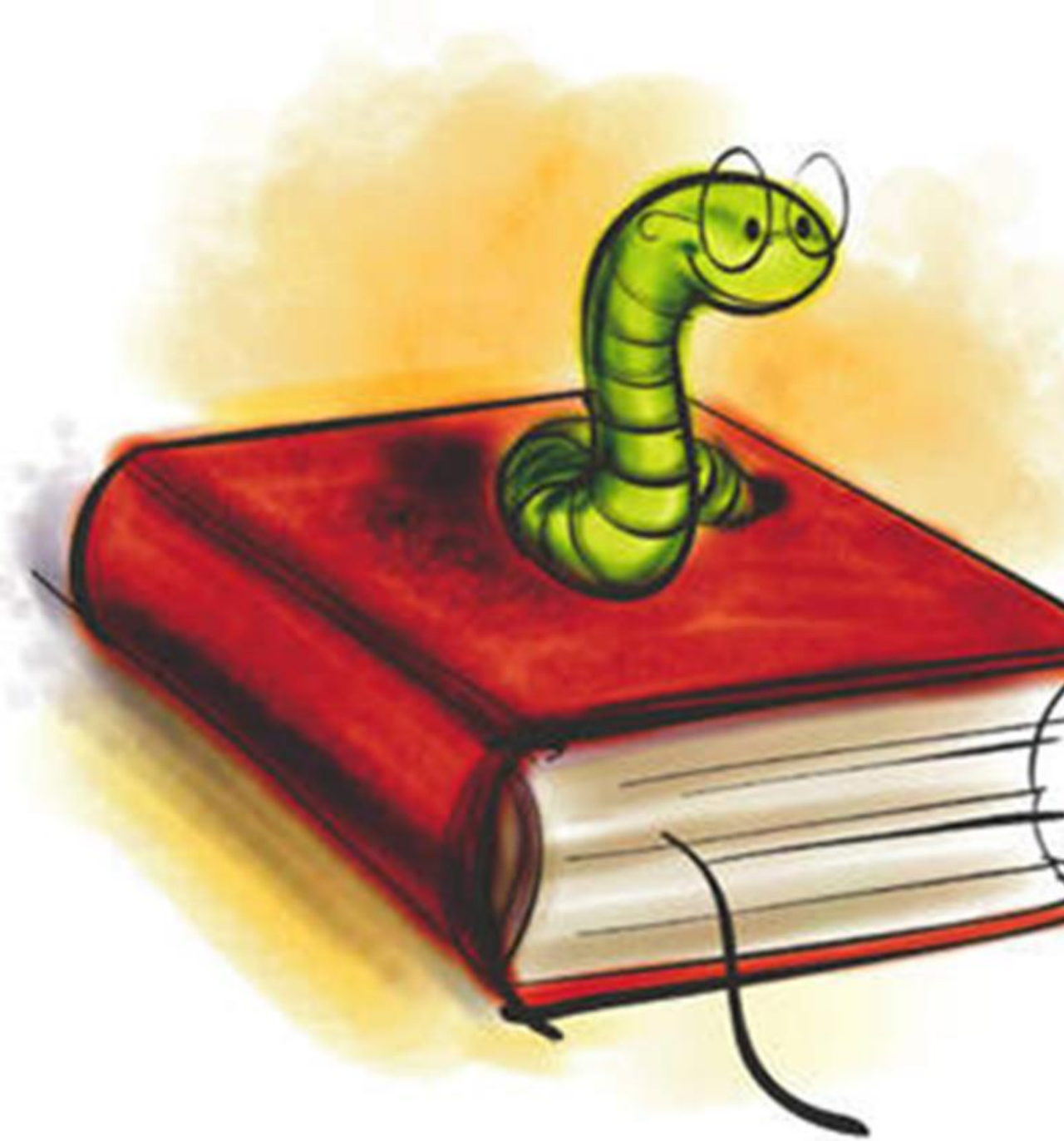

SPaG Terms

Some of this week's spellings are **SPaG** (Spelling, Punctuation and Grammar) words. Can you match the words with their meanings?

adjective

Tells us **what is happening** in the sentence.

adverb

Tells us **more information** about a noun, such as size, colour, looks, feelings, behaviour.

verb

Tells us about **how, when** and **where** something was done or happened.

How many words can you think of that are verbs?

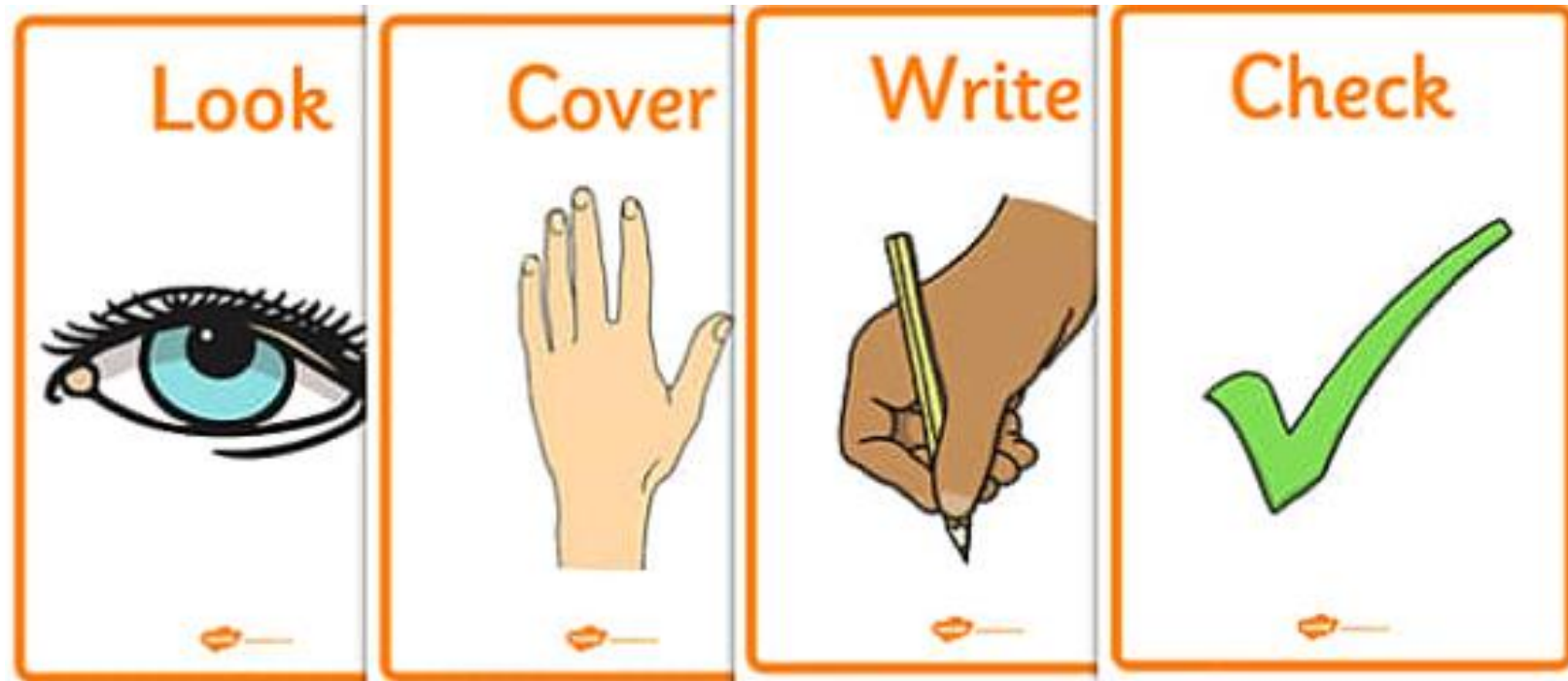
