#### Which one is the VERB?


Ever so slowly, the man crawled on his belly across the swamp.

An adverb tells you where, why or how much something is done.


# Some adverbs are made by adding 'ly' onto the end of the word.

Daniel coloured his picture carefully.




Hi my name is Naomi Noun and I like naming things. My job is to make sure people, places and animals have a name.






An adjective is adds more information to a noun.
