she **runs quickly**.

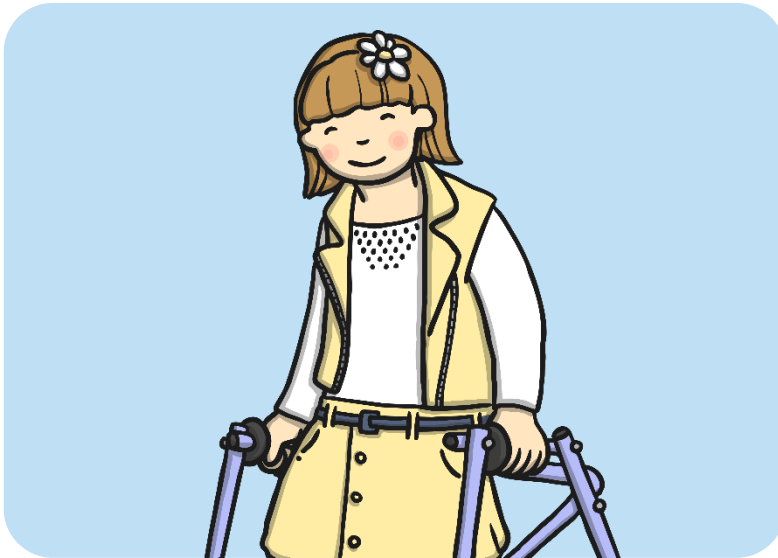


That's my job, to tell

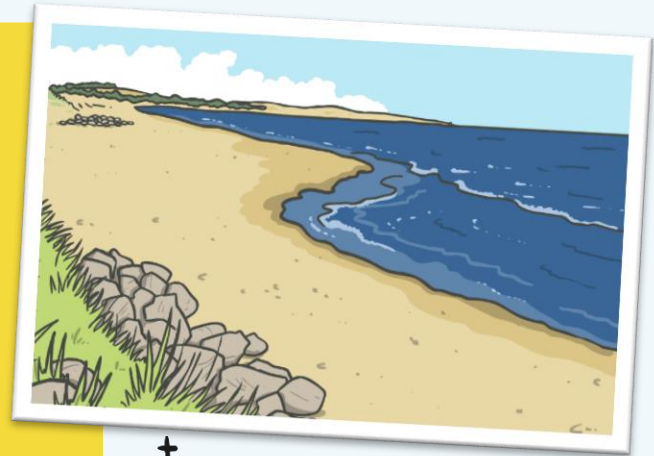

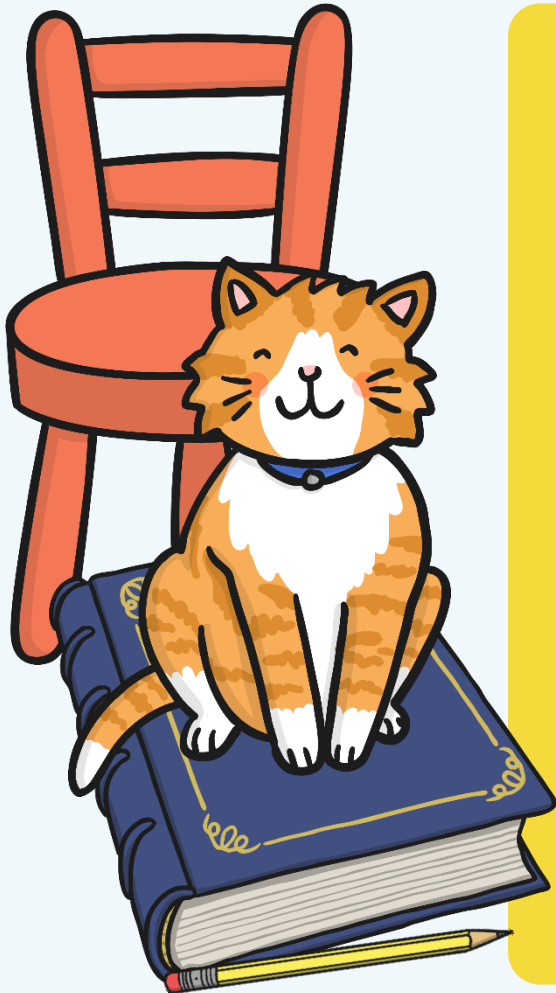

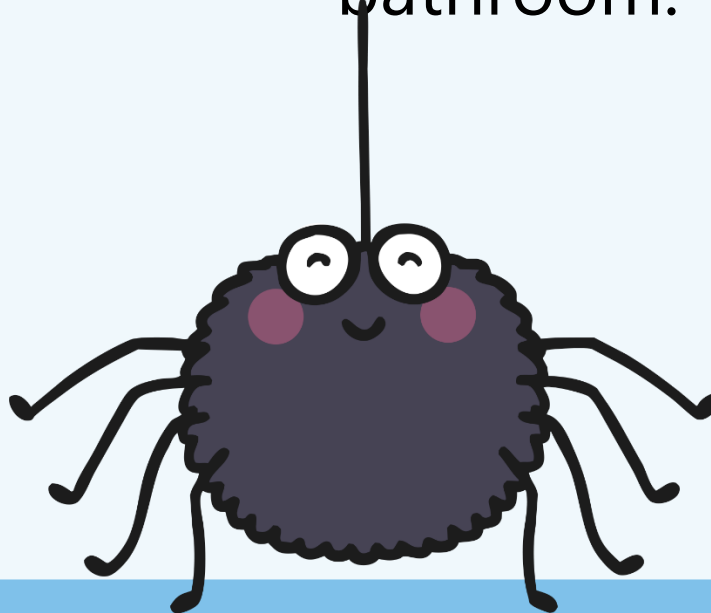


An adjective is adds more
