Clauses



A clause is a group of words that has a subject and a verb.


All simple sentences include a clause.

The monster roared loudly.

The subject

The verb

Compound Sentences



When we join two clauses together, they become a compound sentence.

We already know at least one way to do this – by using *and*.

The monster roared loudly. He scared the little girl.

We join our clauses together using conjunctions. The word **and** is a conjunction.

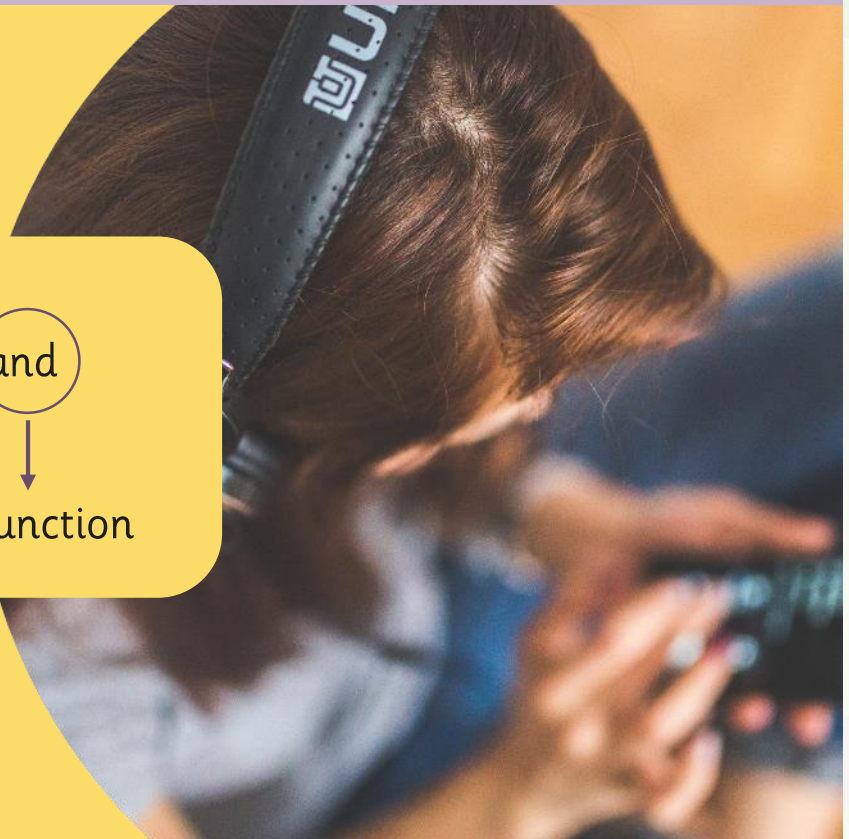

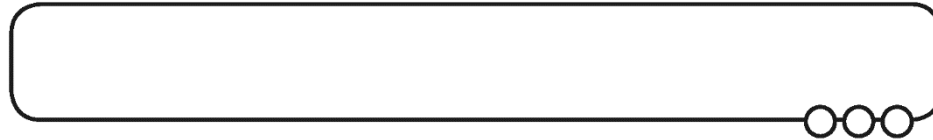

Subordinating Conjunctions



When we use a conjunction e.g. *and*, both clauses are as important as each other.

The monster roared loudly *and* he chased the little girl.

Sometimes we want to add more information to our sentences. This information is extra and not as important as our main clause. When we want to do this, we use a subordinating conjunction.

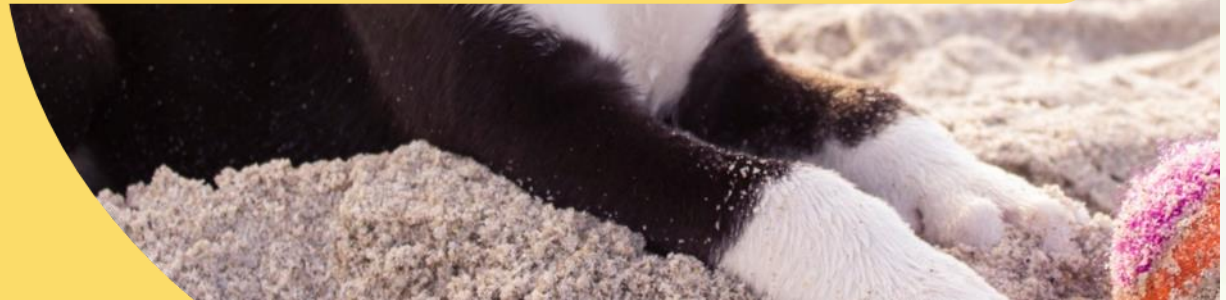
The subordinating conjunction doesn't always have to be in the middle of the sentence. It can also be used at the beginning.
