
Curriculum Information - Reception - Spring week 5 - 01.02.20

Ligisi	A very important topic and particularly this year, our children are experiencing things that are very different, scary and new to use all. This morning we want you to start your day, or take another time in your day to do something you enjoy! Something that makes your happy!

Maths	Please see the subitising bingo game uploaded onto Purple mash (similar to last week) But this time when the adults say the number you have to find one more! Try to encourage the children not to count when they are matching.

Art	Can you create an owl? You can draw, paint, and use junk modelling or any other materials you would like to use. You can draw all three owls or just one? Here is an example of one way you could create some owl art - Using cotton wool, a peg and paint!

Try first using an empty plastic bottle, place it in the water what happens? Now fill it with water the place it in the water. What happens now? Find your floating and sinking checklist on purple mash

	Start using numbers to 10. The biggest number first. E.g. 6 + 3 =		
	You could use a dice to roll two numbers, then write your number sentence and work out your		
	answers!

	You could use counters to add, your fingers or jump forwards on a number line!
