# Reminders:

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Instructions usually begin with a sentence or two explaining what the instructions are **for**.

After that, a set of instructions is written as a series of **commands**.

In a command, verbs are in the **imperative** or '**bossy**' form (*Move, Make, Do not stop, etc.*)

Some verbs are in the **present tense** rather than in the past tense (*I reach the door*).

Instructions follow a sequence or set order, and use **sequencing words and phrases** to indicate this (*Then, Following this, Once you have..., Lastly, etc.*).
