
As ever, if there is anything else I can do for you or your mums and dads please, please let me know. We will make sure you have whatever provision you need.

Our work this week focuses on word problems using all four operations (Addition, Subtraction, Multiplication and Division). There is an explanation of the task and reminders of how to use formal written methods.</p> <p>After you have done this, use the worksheets, LBQ or My Maths to show your understanding.</p>

Science	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> This week you shall be consolidating learning Animals Including Humans. This week you shall be focusing on the varied dietary differences between carnivores, omnivores and herbivores whilst classifying various animals into these three subgroups. There will be frequent tasks set on LBQ to support your scientific learning too. 	
Geography	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> This week, we are continuing with our Mountains topic! This week you are going to be focusing on the high peaks closer to home. You are going to be exploring the mountains of the British Isles applying your Map working skills whilst considering how mountain ranges are mapped using contouring. 	
Art	<p>This week in art, you are continuing with the final phase of our ceramics exploration. This week you are focusing of Ancient Egyptian ceramics and you will have chance to make a ceramic piece of your choice. Please do share any that you make with Mr. Spencer, we would love to see!</p>
