Using time conjunctions

What are conjunctions? Conjunctions are used to join ideas in a sentence. They are used to give more information, give reasons or other ideas - they join the ideas together.

They can be used at the **beginning** of a sentence.

When the dog had settled in his basket, he began to snore gently.

Or they can be used in the **middle** of a sentence.

The dog began to snore gently **when** he had settled in his basket.

More examples can be seen below:

Before she left for school, she brushed her teeth.

She brushed her teeth, **before** she left for school.

After the rain had stopped, the children went out to play.

The children went out to play **after** the rain had stopped.

Friday 26th June, 2020

Causal and contrasting conjunctions

Today we are going to be exploring causal conjunctions.

Causal conjunctions are used to explain how things work or why things happen.

I got soaking wet in the rain **because** I didn't have my umbrella with me.



I didn't have breakfast today, **so** I am really hungry now!



I am about to walk the dog **hence** my casual clothes and wellingtons.



Top tip:

Use a comma before a **coordinating conjunction** if it links two independent, complete 'thoughts', i.e. clauses with a subject and verb in each.

For example:

My hamster loved to play, **so** I gave him a spinning wheel.

Here 'so' links two independent clauses.
