



Standard English Verb Inflections.



‘Do’ is a common verb in English. It can be used as a main verb, an auxiliary verb, and to form questions.

‘Did’ and ‘done’ are the past tenses of the verb ‘do’.



In the simple past tense, the correct use of 'do' is:

did

I did
you did
we did
they did
he did
she did
it did

NOTE: It is **not** 'I done', 'we done', etc.

In the **present perfect tense**, 'do' uses the auxiliary verb 'have' or 'has'. In this context we use 'done' instead of 'did'.

Examples:

have done

I have done
you have done
we have done
they have done

has done

he has done
she has done
it has done

In the **past progressive tense**, 'do' uses the auxiliary verb 'were'. Here the correct form of 'do' is 'doing'.

Examples:

were doing

you were doing
we were doing
they were doing

was doing

I was doing
she was doing
he was doing
it was doing

NOTE: It is **not** 'you was', 'we was', 'I were', 'she were'.

Using 'Do'

Subject	Present Tense	Past Tense	Present Perfect	Past Progressive
I	do	did	have done	was doing
you we they	do	did	have done	were doing
he she it	does	did	has done	was doing
